Baptism in the Bible

I. General

- A. In the KJB, "baptize" (in its various forms) is used 100 times in 76 verses and "John (the) Baptist" is used another 15 times in 15 verses.
- B. The English word "baptize" is a *transliteration* of the Greek word "baptizo" and can represent the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

II. Motivation for this Study

Today when you ask people the eternally important question: "Are you 100% certain you are saved and will go to Heaven when you die?" the answer you most often get is "I was baptized when I was ____ years old." (**Big Problem!!**)

- III. Questions Answered in this Study ("tradition"→ Mark 7:1-13; 2 Thess. 2:15, 3:6)
 - A. **Doctrinally**, is Jesus' post-resurrection commission given: 1) to the church to preach the Gospel of the Grace of God **or** 2) to the eleven apostles to proclaim the Gospel of the Kingdom? Matt. 28:18-20; Mark 16:15-18; Luke 24:46-49; John 20:19-23; Acts 1:8 (Contrast with Romans 16:25-26; Eph. 3:1-9)
 - B. **Is it scriptural** to teach that a new believer's first act of obedience is to get water baptized?
 - C. Is it scriptural to teach, imply, or suggest that **not** having been water baptized proves a person is rebellious, disobedient, out of the will of God, disqualified to serve the Lord, and/or was likely never saved in the first place?
 - D. Is it scriptural to teach that water baptism is the believer's first step of faith?
 - E. **Is it scriptural** to teach that water baptism is a prerequisite to serving the Lord in a local church?
 - F. If water baptism is **not required** for salvation (as Baptist churches correctly teach), **is it scriptural** (or even a good idea) to **require** a believer to get water baptized in order to become a member of a local church?
 - G. When a local church **requires** water baptism in order to become a member, are people being led to believe water baptism is **somehow connected** to their salvation?
 - H. Is water baptism a **spiritual** event or a **physical** event? (**FACT** \rightarrow Nobody in the Bible is ever placed into a **spiritual body** (KoG) by **physical means**!)
 - I. Where does the KJB teach that water baptism symbolizes anything?
 - J. Where in the KJB is water baptism shown to be an ordinance of the Church?

 - A. Baptism unto Moses. 1 Cor. 10:1-2; Ex. 14:21-31
 - B. Baptism for "the dead" (a cultic practice for individuals!). 1 Cor. 15:29
 - C. Baptism of the lost into unquenchable fire. Matt. 3:11-12; Luke 3:16
 - D. Baptism into physical suffering / death. Matt. 20:22-23; Mark 10:38-39; Luke 12:50
 - E. Water baptism. Matt. 3:1-6 (v.6→FM). 11-17, 21:25; 28:16-20; Acts 1:5,22, 2:38-41, 8:5-17, 26-40, 9:17-18, 10:34-48, 11:1-18; 13:14-30, 16:14-15, 25-34, 18:4-8, 24-28, 19:1-6, 22:6-16; 1 Cor. 1:10-17; Heb. 6:1-6; 1 Pet. 3:21
 - (Parallel passages in the other 3 gospels: **Mark** 1:4-9, 11:30; 16:16; **Luke** 3:3,7,12,16, 21, 7:29-30, 20:4; **John** 1:25-33, 3:22-26, 4:1-2, 10:40)
 - F. Holy Ghost (Spirit) baptism. Matt. 3:11; Mark 1:8; Luke 3:16; John 1:33; Acts 1:5, 11:16; Rom. 6:3-4, 1 Cor. 12:13, Gal. 3:27; Eph. 4:4-5; Col. 2:9-12

CONCLUSIONS

- 1. Since 1) the Kingdom of Heaven was "at hand" (still being offered) until the stoning of Stephen in Acts 7, 2) Paul was not converted until Acts 9 (~A.D. 35), and 3) the revelation of the mystery of salvation through the Gospel of the Grace of God could not be in full force until after it was revealed to Paul, it would seem clear that Jesus' post-resurrection commission to his remaining eleven apostles was to preach the Gospel of the Kingdom, not the Gospel of the Grace of God. Today, in the Church Age, we apply Jesus' commission practically to exhort believers to preach the Gospel of the Grace of God. Rom. 1:15; 1 Cor. 1:17-18; 9:16-18; 2 Tim. 4:2
- 2. In the gospels (M/M/L/J), water baptism is connected with the Gospel of the Kingdom. Nearly all water baptisms referenced in the **transitional** book of Acts (at the inception of the Church) appear to be a "hold-over" practice from the pre-Calvary preaching of the Gospel of the Kingdom. It is worth noting the apostolic sign gift of healing was still in effect in Acts 28:7-9. (1 Cor. 1:22; Mark 16:17-18)
- 3. Water baptism is not found in the Pauline epistles, except for Paul explaining that he had only baptized a very few people and that Christ had not sent him to water baptize, but rather to preach the gospel (Gospel of the Grace of God). 1 Cor. 1:11-17
- 4. Except for item 3. above, **all** references to "baptism" in the Pauline epistles are **Holy Spirit** baptism, **not** water baptism. (See underlined references in IV. F. above)
- 5. Since water baptism is **not** required for salvation in the Church Age under the Gospel of the Grace of God, a *dispensational understanding* of water baptism is essential when contemplating the water baptism of any believer.
