DISPENSATIONAL TRUTH

RIGHTLY DIVIDING THE WORD OF TRUTH - 2 Tim. 2:15

Dispensation - The different doctrines whereby God deals with (i.e. reveals, speaks to, dispenses, or ministers to) different groups of people at different times of history.

- A. "dispensation" used 4X in KJB. 1 Cor. 9:17; Eph. 1:10; Eph. 3:2; Col. 1:25
- B. Everyone who ultimately ends up in the family of God has their sins purged (i.e. their sins completely forgiven, removed, and taken away forever) through the pure shed blood (D/B/R) of Jesus Christ at the Cross of Calvary. However, each dispensation has its own unique requirements for living (and dying) in right relationship (i.e. "safe"→Prov. 29:25) with God. Acts 4:12; John 14:6; 1 Tim. 2:1-6; John 3:16; 1 John 2:1-2

CHARACTERISTICS OF BIBLE DISPENSATIONS

1. INNOCENCE

Primary Bible Character(s): Adam & Eve References - Gen. 1-3 Right Relationship with God Based On: Obeying God's one commandment. - Gen. 2:16-17 How Dispensation Ends: Adam & Eve disobey God. - Gen. 3

2. CONSCIENCE

Primary Bible Character(s): Noah & Abraham

References - Gen 4-50; Gen. 6:5-9; Gen. 22:1-18; Job; Rom. 2:13-15; James 2:21-24; Heb. 11:7 Right Relationship with God Based On: Believing and actively obeying God according to the conscience God gave every man.

How Dispensation Ends: Mankind fails to follow his conscience and God drowns out the whole world except for Noah, his 3 sons, and their wives (8 people) - Gen. 6-7; Gen. 6:11-13

3. LAW

Primary Bible Character(s): Moses & David

References - Exodus-Malachi; Gen. 9:1-6; Ex. 20:1-17 (Deut. 5:6-22) Right Relationship with God Based On: Believing and actively obeying God. - Deut. 32:18-22; Ps. 9:17; 1 Kings 2:3; Ex. 4:1-9 Note that David feared losing the Holy Spirit. - Ps. 51:11-12 How Dispensation Ends: Mankind fails to keep God's Law. - Gal. 3:21-29

4. JESUS CHRIST MINISTERING ON EARTH

Primary Bible Character(s): John the Baptist - Matt. 3:1-12; John 1:1-37; Jesus Christ - Matt. 15:24; Twelve Apostles - Matt 10:1-8 (ministries prior to Calvary and primarily to Jews) References - Matthew - John (the four gospels); John 4:23-24 (transition to a spiritual economy rather than a physical economy); Acts 19:1-6

Right Relationship with God Based On: Believing and discipleship, i.e. actively obeying, following, and serving the Lord Jesus Christ. - Matt. 4:18-23; Matt. 5-7 (Sermon on the Mount); Matt. 19:16-22

How Dispensation Ends: Mankind fails. Jesus Christ was rejected as the Messiah and Saviour, and this was immediately followed by the crucifixion of Jesus Christ.

5. CHURCH AGE

Primary Bible Character(s): The Apostle Paul and all believers saved by grace through faith in the Lord Jesus Christ until the Rapture of the Church.

NOTE: The Jews reject Jesus Christ so the Jews are set aside *temporarily*. - Rom. 11:20-25 In four places in the book of Acts, God turns away from dealing with the Jews as a nation and turns to the Gentiles. - Acts 7:54-60; 13:46; 18:1-6; 28:28-31

References - Romans - Philemon and any Bible verses which match the Pauline Epistles. -Rom. 11:6, 13; Rom. 16:25; Eph. 4:30; 1 Thess. 5:9; 1 Cor. 15:51-52; 1 Thess. 4:13-18;

Right Relationship with God Based On: Grace through faith alone in the D/B/R of the Lord Jesus Christ without good works and without water baptism. - Rom. 3:19-31; 4:5-8; 5:15-21; 6:23; 11:25-26; Eph. 2:8-9; 3:1-6; Gal. 2:16, 3:26; John 3:36, 5:24; Titus 3:5; 1 Pet. 1:3-5; 1 Cor. 1:17; 1 Cor. 12:13; 1 Cor. 15:3-4; 1 Pet. 3:21; Col. 2:10-14

How Dispensation Ends: Mankind fails. The Gentile bride (church/body of Christ) is saved and raptured, but both Gentiles & Jews largely end up rejecting the gospel of the grace of God.

6. TRIBULATION

Primary Bible Character(s): Antichrist, lost Jews and lost Gentiles which are left behind after Rapture of Church.

References - Daniel; 1 John 2:18; 2 John 1:7; 2 Thess. 2:1-12; Rev. 13; 17:8-18; 20:4; Jer. 30:7; Isa. 33:1-15; Matt. 24; Luke 21:21-28; Rev. 6-18 (Four accounts of the Tribulation: Seals-Rev.6, Trumpets-Rev.8; Vials-Rev.15-16; Doom of Babylon-Rev.17-18)

Right Relationship with God Based On: Believing in Jesus and keeping the commandments of God. - Deut. 4:30; Heb. 10:26-27, 38-39; 1 John 3:23-24; Rev. 7:1-17, 12:17, 13:10, 14:9-12

How Dispensation Ends: Mankind fails and Jesus Christ comes back (2nd Advent); Christ fights/destroys His enemies at the battle of Armageddon. - Isa. 34; Rev. 16:13-16; 19:17-21

7. MILLENNIUM

Primary Bible Character(s): Jesus Christ reigning (as KING OF KINGS, AND LORD OF LORDS" - Rev. 19:16) from the throne of David in Jerusalem and all saints on the earth who will dwell in the Kingdom of Heaven (on earth) for 1000 years.

References - Rev. 20:1-10; Isa. 11, 35; Matt. 4:23-25, 5:3, 20, 22, 11:12; Matt 5-7 (Sermon on the Mount ; i.e. Rules and Regulations for the Millennial Kingdom); Isa. 65:17-20 (Sin still present in Mill.); Hag. 2:9, Ps. 72:3 (Peace on earth until the final "Gog and Magog" war that ends all wars \rightarrow Rev. 20)

The 12 apostles shall sit upon 12 thrones and judge the 12 tribes of Israel according to the ancient OT theocratic judgeship. - 1 Kings 4:7; Matt. 19:28; Luke 22:30; Rev. 21:12

Right Relationship with God Based On: Believing and actively obeying God. - Isa. 65:18-20 How Dispensation Ends: Mankind fails and rebels against God and fire comes down from God out of Heaven and devours all remaining enemies of God. - Rev. 20:1-15

ETERNITY FUTURE

<u>Eternity Future</u> has similarities to the Millennium, but then **no sin** will be possible and **time shall be no more**. AMEN! - Isa. 65:17; 2 Pet. 3:7-14; Rev. 21-22

God wipes away all tears two times in the Bible: 1) following Judgment Seat of Christ (near/at the end of the Tribulation) - Rev. 7:17 and 2) following Great White Throne Judgment - Rev. 21:4; Isa. 25:8
