

THE THREE GOSPELS IN THE NEW TESTAMENT

“**Gospel**” is defined in the Bible as “glad or good tidings” (often referred to simply as “good news”) - Rom. 10:15; Isa. 52:7

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| Gospel of the Kingdom | Gospel of the Grace of God | My Gospel | Everlasting Gospel |
| Matt. 4:23, 9:35; Mark 1:14 | Acts 20:24; 1 Cor. 15:3-4 | Rom. 2:16, 16:25; 2 Tim. 2:8 | Rev. 14:6 |
| This is the good news of the establishment of a 1000 year earthly, literal, physical, visible Jewish Kingdom over which Jesus Christ, as David's heir, shall rule as King. | This is the good news preached today in the Church Age: It is Jesus Christ's D/B/R to pay for the sins of the world at the Cross of Calvary, to be received by faith alone without works. | This is the good news of the gospel of the grace of God and is called “my gospel” in the 3 references shown above (which is referring to “Paul's gospel” of the grace of God.) | This is the good news that will be preached by an angel <i>to Gentiles</i> (not to Jews or to the Church) near the end of the Great Tribulation. |
| This gospel was preached during the earthly ministry of Jesus Christ to the nation of Israel, and will be preached again to Israel during the Great Tribulation, just before the Second Advent. - Mt. 24:14 | Called “the gospel of Christ” because it was paid by Christ's pure blood sacrifice. Rom. 1:16, 15:19, 29, 1 Cor. 9:12, 18; 2 Cor. 9:13, 10:14; Gal. 1:6-9; Phil. 1:27; 1 Thess. 3:2 | This gospel includes the added revelations to Paul, e.g. the mystery of each believer being a member of Christ's body (Col. 1:25-28), the Rapture (1 Thess. 4:13-18), commission to preach the gospel (1 Cor. 9:16), etc. | The message will be “Fear God, and give glory to him” and “worship him” (the Lord) - Rev. 14:7 (NOTE: The message has nothing to do with the D/B/R of Jesus Christ or the grace of God.) |
| This gospel was also preached by John the Baptist. - Matt. 3:1-2, 10-12 | Called “the gospel of God” in Rom. 1:1 because it originated from God's love for sinners. - Rom. 5:8 | This gospel is also called “the glorious gospel” - 2 Cor. 4:4; 1 Tim. 1:11 | Those who do not obey this gospel are damned forever in hell. - Rev. 14:9-11 |
| This Kingdom will be the fulfillment of the Davidic Covenant. 2 Sam. 7:16 | Preached by Peter in Acts 15:1-11 | NOTE: “my gospel” is the same gospel as the “gospel of the grace of God.” | |
| Physical signs, healings, and miracles accompany this gospel. Mt. 4:17-25 | Receiving this gospel places the believer in the <i>spiritual</i> Kingdom of God. Jn. 1:12, 3:3; Rom. 14:17 | This gospel was a “mystery” until it was revealed to Paul. Eph. 6:19; Rom. 16:25 Eph. 3:1-6, 5:32 | |
| This gospel was rejected by the Jews during Christ's ministry on earth, but will be accepted by a remnant of Jews in the Great Tribulation | | | |
