GETTING PREPARED FOR SUCCESSFUL SOUL WINNING

- I. YOU MUST PRAY. 1 Thess. 5:17; 1 Tim. 2:1
 - A. "Before we ever step onto the battlefield of preaching, teaching, or witnessing (soul-winning), the outcome has already been determined on the battlefield of prayer". (Ronald Dunn in his book <u>Don't Just Stand There, Pray Something</u>, p. 68)
 - B. Pray EVERY DAY for lost people (including lost family members) by name.
 - C. Pray for the lost in our community, county, and around the world. Acts 1:8
 - D. Plead for God's leadership, power, anointing, and unction to be a soul-winner.
 - E. Pray for and then look for opportunities to proclaim the gospel of Jesus Christ.
- II. YOU MUST BE BURDENED FOR LOST PEOPLE WHICH ARE HEADED TO HELL.
 - A. Acts 20:19, 31; Heb. 5:7; 2 Cor. 2:4; Rom. 9:1-3
 - B. You must love lost people with the love Christ showed at the cross. Rom. 5:8
 - C. You must sow in tears if you are to reap in joy. Ps. 126:5-6
- III. YOU MUST STRIVE TO GET ALL KNOWN SIN OUT OF YOUR LIFE.
 - A. Jer. 7:3; Acts 8:22; Col 3:5-10; Eph. 4:22-32; 1 Pet. 2:1
 - B. You must fix any broken relationships, if possible.
 - C. You must not hold grudges or be a bitter person. Heb. 12:15; James 3:13-14
 - D. You must keep all accounts settled with the Lord. 1 John 1:9
 - E. You must keep a clear conscience before God and men. Acts 24:16
- IV. YOU MUST OBEY THE LORD AND THE SCRIPTURES.
 - A. Joshua 1:8-9; Ps. 78:7-8; John 14:15, 15:10
- V. YOU MUST LEARN TO FOLLOW THE LEADERSHIP OF THE HOLY SPIRIT. A. John 14:26; 1 John 2:20, 27
- VI. YOU MUST BE WILLING TO LEARN. Prov. 1:5, 9:9, 16:23
 - A. You must have a soul-winning plan or method. (See back page)
 - B. You must be teachable.
 - C. You must learn from your mistakes.
 - D. You must be willing, by faith, to step out of your "comfort zone". Heb. 11:6
- VII. YOU MUST BE PRESENTABLE. 2 Cor. 5:18-20
 - A. You must remember you are representing the Lord Jesus Christ and our church.
 - B. You must *not* present yourself in a fleshly, carnal, or worldly manner.
- VIII. YOU MUST BE PATIENT, CONSISTENT, PERSISITENT, AND BOLD.
 - Prov. 11:30, 28:1; Isa. 40:31; Dan. 12:3; Acts 4:12-13, 29-31; 2 Cor. 4:16, 7:1-4; Gal. 6:9; Phil. 1:14-20; 2 Thess. 1:4; Eph. 6:19-20; 2 Tim. 2:1-4, 4:5
 - B. You must make soul-winning a *high priority* in your daily walk with the Lord.
 - C. You must determine in your heart that you are going to be a soul-winner.
 - D. You must keep a supply of gospel tracts with you anytime you leave your house.
 - E. The soul-winner's job is to faithfully and properly deliver the true gospel to the lost!
 - F. NOTE: Always remember the "RESULTS" are between the lost person and God!

SOUL WINNING PLAN

I. Break the Ice

- A. Before you start visiting, turn your mobile phone to "silent" or turn it completely off.
- B. Be aware of your surroundings and be respectful of other people's property.
- C. Use common sense regarding closing gates, dogs, or other obstacles.
- D. Be calm at the door. (Pray beforehand to ask God to calm your fears and anxieties.)
- E. Knock firmly but not violently. (Many today are fearful of strangers at the door!)
- F. If nobody is home, leave a tract in an obvious and secure place near door (not in mailbox).
- G. If a young child answers the door, ask if you can talk to his/her mom or dad.
- H. Introduce yourself, your partner, the church, and offer a tract right away. Isa. 55:11
- I. Be polite, warm, meek, gentle, tenderhearted, longsuffering, courteous, and **BOLD**!
- J. Family, Interests, Church/Religious Background
- II. Role of the partner Mark 6:7; Luke 10:1-3
 - A. Silent prayer.
 - B. Handle distractions, e.g. dogs, babies, etc.
 - C. Take notes, e.g. names, decisions, action items, and other pertinent information.
 - D. Maintain map showing streets/houses already visited and those which still need visited.
- III. Memorize these 2 key questions:
 - "If you were to die today, are you 100% certain you would go to Heaven? If the person says "YES", ask them to explain how they are sure of it. Listen carefully to see if you get a "works" answer or a "by grace through faith alone in Jesus" answer. If the person says "NO" or "I'M NOT SURE", ask them if you can show them from the scriptures how they can be sure. Then go through all the verses in our gospel tract.
 - 2. "Suppose you died today and you found yourself standing before God, and He asked you "Why should I let you into Heaven?" what would you say to Him?" This question will nearly always tell you if the person is lost or saved! If the person gives you a works answer, e.g. I'm a good person, I'm doing my best, I'm a member of a certain church, I've been baptized, I live a clean life, etc. then go through our gospel tract to show them that salvation is a gift by faith in Jesus Christ, and that salvation cannot be earned by good works. Rom. 10:3-4; Titus 3:5; Rom. 4:5; 5:1; Eph. 2:8-9; Gal. 3:26
- IV. Personal Testimony (*if appropriate*).
 - A. Give a *short* summary of how you got saved. Include *all elements* of the gospel (DBR).
 - B. Don't use "churchy terminology" such as: "I went forward and got saved" or "I gave my heart to Jesus" or "I accepted Christ" or "I became a follower of Christ".
- V. Keep everything simple and to the point.
 - A. Don't let the conversation be diverted into foolish questions (it wastes time). Titus 3:9
 - B. NEVER mix "POSITION" (salvation) with "PRACTICE" (service, obedience, discipleship).
 - C. Be prepared to handle objections such as James 2:14,17,20,26 "faith without works is dead".
 - D. **As you go** through each subject and verse of our gospel tract, make sure they understand, agree with, and believe each verse.
 - E. Answer any questions or objections.
 - F. The partner who is *not* leading the conversation should be praying silently for the Holy Spirit to show the lost person the truth and that they will get saved right now.

VI. CLOSE THE DEAL!!

- A. Memorize this question: **"Would be willing to call on the Lord and receive the free gift of eternal life right now?"** Repeat Rom. 10:13 & review the sample prayer at end of tract.
- B. Lead the person to pray on their own a prayer similar to the one on the gospel tract **or** (if they prefer) lead them through the prayer, phrase by phrase, asking them to pray **to the Lord** (not to you) **out loud** so you are able lead them through the prayer.
- C. Follow up \rightarrow KJV Bible; bring to church; discipleship; Bible Study.
